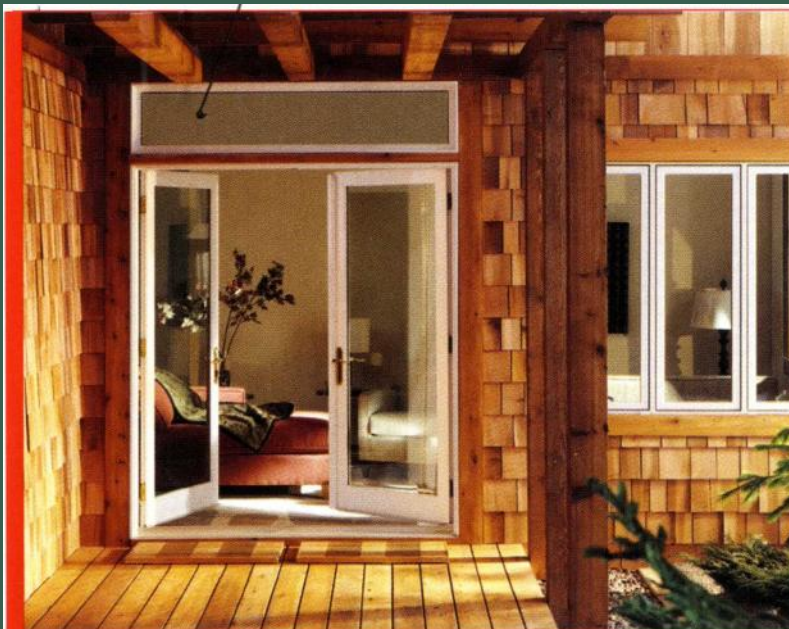


## French Doors



(out-swing), Divided lite.

## French Doors



In-swing; non-divided lite with Transom window above (space between top of door and bottom of transom; *i.e.* Window is part of door frame structure.)

## French Doors



(In-swing) Non-dividing lites, with transom attached (or mulled) to the door unit.

## Atrium Doors



(Hinged in center) In-swing, non-divided lite. Transoms mulled (attached) to the door frame.

## Glider Doors



(divided lite); two panel, one panel glides while the other stationary.

## Glider Doors



(Full-lite); floor panels, two center panels open.

## Bi-Fold (accordion) Doors.



Full lite. (no dividers)

## Lift & Slide Doors



(or Telescoping glass doors) Four panels which recess into the wall.

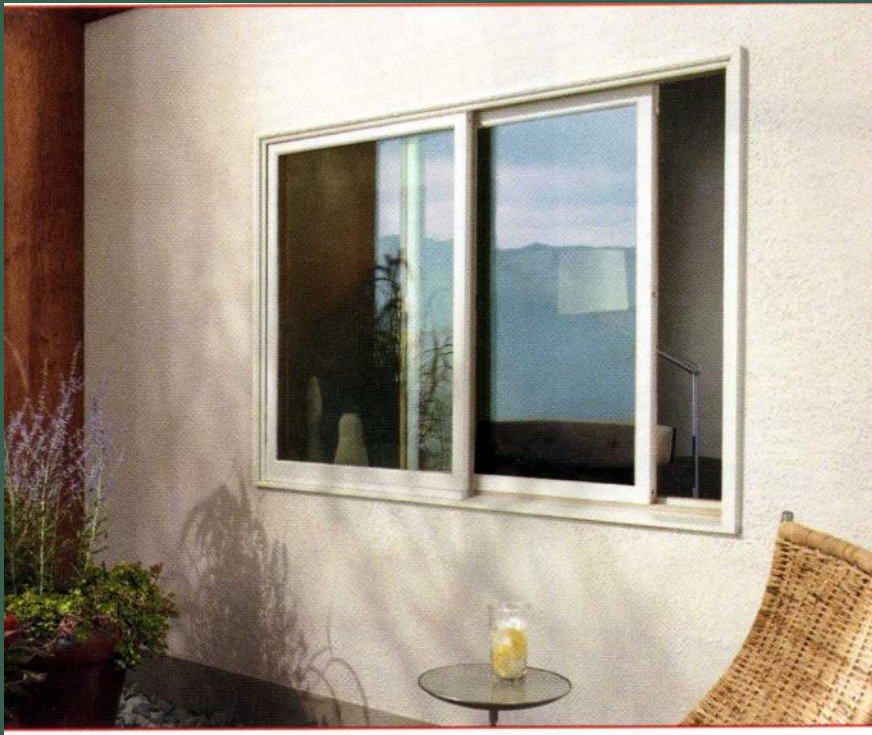
## Single and Double Hung Windows



Single Hung—(Lower Sash Rises)

Double Hung — (Both Sashes Open)

## Horizontal Slider Windows



(Sash slides left or right to open)

## Horizontal Slider Windows



Sashes on either side of a fixed pane slide toward center to open.

## Casement Windows



Sash cranks out, screen is on the inside. These windows do not come in aluminum, but do come in aluminum clad, wood, or vinyl.

## French Casement Windows



With transoms\* above. The pair of sashes crank out. Notice there is no divider (or style) between the two sashes. Screens are on the inside.

\*Transom: notice the windows above the French Casements. These are called transoms. They appear to be connected to the casement below but are in fact separated by framing. Thus they are not mulled.

## Awning Windows



The Awning windows in this picture are below casement windows. They crank out with hinges at the top. The screens are on the inside. The windows above are casement. They are mulled (attached) to one-another. We often utilize a fixed window above a casement awning when we are trying to enhance our view and maintain ventilation. This is usually less expensive.

## Turn Tilt Windows



This window will act as a casement or “hopper” (tilts in at the top). The window opens in and is easier to clean.
